8th ANNUAL YOUTH BREEDING/MEAT LAMB SHOW

1. Classes will be finalized after the show check-in.
2. If the animal's identity is found to differ from initial weigh-in exhibitor will forfeit any prize money and/or sale proceeds, any add-ons and forfeit all rights and privileges to exhibit in the future.
3. Meat lambs shall be less than fourteen months old by show date. Meat lambs with unknown birth dates shall not have shed the front two "baby" teeth.
4. Either sex may be shown in the Meat lamb class, however, individual female lambs may not be shown in both Meat & Breeding classes.
5. Meat lambs must weigh a minimum of 25 pounds at check-in, and a minimum of 70 pounds at final weigh-in.
6. Youth may enter meat lamb class and as many breeding lambs as desired, however, premiums will be paid only on a total of 5 lambs (excluding showmanship premiums).
7. All meat lambs must be owned by January 8, 2022. Breeding lambs must be owned by January 30, 2022 or leased at least 60 days prior to show date. Entry deadline for the market class is January 8, 2022. Entry deadline for breeding classes is January 30, 2022. Entries for the Meat and Breeding classes should be mailed or delivered to:
8. Entries may be shown with either halter or collar.
9. Animals will be eligible for auction/sale at the owner's discretion.
10. Non-exhibitors will not be allowed in the ring during any portion of the show, unless authorized by show superintendent.
11. All lambs must have been dehorned or naturally polled.
12. Standardized record books will be available online. These record books are due to the show superintendent on March 25, 2022. A record of show, which will include photos and story, will be due by April 4, 2022 no later than 4:30 P.M. A forfeiture of one third of all premiums will be made if the appropriate record books are not submitted in a timely manner, or if any portion of the record book is incomplete.

Youth, if participating in showmanship, can only show an animal that was shown in the class.
